## Contributors

**Gabriele Angeli** holds a master's in library and information studies from University College Dublin (UCD), Ireland. He has provided expert cataloguing and research services to cultural heritage institutions for over 20 years. **Nalini Balbir** is Professor Emerita of Indology at Sorbonne-Nouvelle University (Paris) and at the École Pratique des Hautes Études (Paris). Her fields of research cover Buddhist and Jain technical terminology, Jain literatures and explorations of contemporary Jainism through Hindi, and Gujarati sources and Jain manuscript cultures (catalogues, colophons, libraries, social networks).

He is Honorary President of the Italian Association for Sanskrit Studies (AISS) and a regular contributor to the Sunday supplement of "Il Sole 24 Ore" for Indian religions and culture.

**Giovanni Ciotti** is currently Assistant Professor of Indology at Alma Mater University of Bologna and spokesperson of the Palm-leaf Manuscript Profiling Initiative (PLMPI) at the Centre for the Study of Manuscript Cultures of University of Hamburg. His main research interests are comparative manuscript studies, especially the history of manuscripts in Tamil Nadu, Sanskrit-Tamil linguistic and literary interactions, and Indian grammatical literature.

Andrea Cuna is Assistant Professor of Archival Science, Bibliography and Library Science at the Department of Languages and Literatures, Communication, Education and Society of University of Udine. He is the Scientific Supervisor of

the "Ranganathan Project". His main areas of research include exploratory and faceted search, cultural heritage information systems, and digital libraries.

**Martina Dello Buono** is a Postdoctoral Researcher at the University of Naples "L'Orientale". She specialises in digital humanities with a focus on UI/UX design and development of digital scholarly editing web applications. Her research interests include web technologies, usability, user experience, and data visualisation. She collaborated on the design and development of the Shivadharma Database for the SHIVADHARMA ERC Project.

**Marco Franceschini** is Associate Professor of Sanskrit and Indology at Alma Mater University of Bologna and a member of the board of the Italian Association for Sanskrit Studies (AISS). His main research interests are premodern Sanskrit literature, particularly Indian classical poetry ( $k\bar{a}vya$ ), the history of manuscripts in Tamil Nadu (with special reference to the study of incorporated paratexts), and the palaeography of the Grantha script.

**Fausto Freschi** is President of the "Luigi Pio Tessitori" Indological Society (Udine) and Subject Expert in Information Literacy at the Department of Languages and Literatures, Communication, Education and Society of University of Udine. He is the Editor of the series *Bibliotheca Indica* and Scientific Supervisor of the LPT Project and ŚĀSTRA research projects. His main research interests are ancient Indian sciences and history of Indology.

**Chiara Livio** is currently Open Access Advisor at the Utrecht University Library. Previously, she conducted her postdoctoral research at Alma Mater University of Bologna and the University of Naples "L'Orientale". Her scholarly work focused on Sanskrit  $k\bar{a}vya$  literature and philology, specialising in the critical edition of commentaries on court poems. She collaborated on the design and development of the Shivadharma Database for the SHIVADHARMA ERC Project.

**Giorgio Milanetti** is Full Professor of Hindi language and literature at Sapienza University (Rome). His research has mainly focused on the early modern period, of which he has analysed literary texts also as sources for the cultural history of the Indian subcontinent. In this field of study, he has published a few monographs and several articles in national and international scientific journals and volumes.

Antonio Rigopoulos is Full Professor of Sanskrit at the Department of Asian and North African Studies of Ca' Foscari University (Venice).
